Lighthouse Point Park

Located ¼ mile east of the Lighthouse via South Atlantic Avenue.

Please Note: Lighthouse Point Park is not affiliated with the Ponce Inlet Lighthouse Museum



Located at the southern tip of the barrier island separating the Atlantic Ocean from the mainland, Lighthouse Point Park is a coastal preserve operated by the Volusia County Department of Parks and Recreation.

Consisting s of 52 acres of pristine land on the north side of Ponce De Leon Inlet, Lighthouse Point Park features a 1,000 foot-long fishing pier situated atop the inlet's north jetty, observation platforms, picnic tables, restroom facilities, and numerous elevated trails that wind through the coastal dune system.

Wildlife abounds throughout this unspoiled preserve including raccoons, possums, skunks, armadillos, shore birds, endangered turtles, aquatic life, and birds of prey.



Visitors may park their vehicles and walk directly onto the sandy Florida beaches. Swimming is allowed both on the beach and along the river although caution must be exercised at all times due to swift currents and undertows.

The park is open to the public seven days a week from sunrise to sunset. Admission is \$5 per vehicle.
